Emotion Coaching



Emotion Coaching is based on the idea that nurturing and emotionally supportive relationships provide the best environment for the promotion of positive children's outcomes and resilience. All staff at Canberra have been trained in Emotion Coaching by our Educational Psychologists and this is part of our Attachment Informed, trauma Sensitive Practice strategy.

Emotion Coached children -

- achieve more academically
 - are more popular
- have fewer behavioural problems
 - have fewer infectious diseases

- are more emotionally stable
 - are more resilient

Emotion Coaching uses moments of heightened emotion and the behaviour that follows to guide and teach the child about more effective ways to respond. It recognises and acknowledges their feelings making them feel listened to and valued before supporting them by setting limits (if required) and problem solving next steps with them.

These four steps can be used in school or at home. Steps 1-3 should be used in the moment and once the child is calm and able to reflect step 4 takes place.

Step 1: Recognise and empathise with the child's feelings

Step 2: Label and validate the feelings

Step 3: Set limits (if needed)

Step 4: Problem solve with the child

Mrs Dickie will focus on Emotion Coaching during her workshop session on 20th November.



United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC)

The UNCRC was made into law in Scotland in January 2024. This law is focused on ensuring that the Rights of children in Scotland are respected, protected and fulfilled. All adults in Scotland are responsible for making sure that this happens. At Canberra our Rights Ambassadors work hard to highlight their Rights to our children and to reflect on our school and the things we do to make sure that all of our children have their Rights met.
