Dear Parent/Carer

We hope that you got through the gloom of January intact and are now enjoying seeing the lighter evenings coming in! We are very busy at Canberra this term and the children are working so hard making progress in both learning and social skills.

We look forward to meeting with our parents and carers at Parent/carer Consultations on 27th February. We are sure that you will enjoy seeing how much your child is progressing. We value your support in helping them continue to thrive and grow both as people and academically!

As we near the Spring Break we are keen to get out and about on another school trip. These trips will be funded by the Participatory Budgeting aspect of our Pupil Equity Fund money. This means that there will be no cost to families and we will be able to afford to pay for entry fees and workshops, as well as the cost of the bus which will allow for a greater range of places to visit. Nursery and P1-7 are currently planning where they would like to go and information will be sent home to parents/carers over the coming weeks.

Unfortunately the system doesn't allow the school to see what has been sent to families so we are unable to check if links etc are working correctly. Please bear with us as we navigate this new system!

The Parent Council have set a date for their Summer Fair of Saturday 31st May. They are in the process of organising this event and would be delighted for parents/carers to come along to meetings to help. More information will be sent out in the coming weeks and months.



Progress Week



Progress Week took place in the last week of January for P1-7. This was an opportunity for the children to pause, reflect and showcase their learning so far this year. The information gathered from observations and assessments during Progress Week, in combination with ongoing classwork, is used by teachers' to make professional judgements about each child's strengths, attainment and next steps. This helps them to plan appropriate learning activities for each child and to report to parents/carers. Parent/Carer consultations (Nursery-P7) will take place on Thursday 27th February and this is a great opportunity for parents to come along with their child to discuss their progress and next steps. An attainment report (P1-7), which details your child's attainment in line with Scottish National Expectations, will be issued prior to Parent/Carer consultations providing a written record of your child's attainment as of February 2025.

Information about booking Parent/Carer consultations will be sent out week beginning 3rd February.
